## **Petition to Birmingham City Council**

We the undersigned believe that the Hamstead Road crossing between St Mary's Church of England Primary

Academy and St Mary's Church Hall presents a significant risk to those who attempt to cross there, not least because of the necessity to park illegally at times when pupils are delivered to or picked up from school. Because the crossing point is used by those who are most vulnerable - the very young; those using pushchairs; and the elderly - there is an increased risk of harm. We therefore request that a pedestrian crossing be installed regulated by traffic lights to prevent any serious accident.
