### **Parents Questionnaires**

I would like to say a big thank you to all the parents who have completed the Parents Questionnaire. A special thank you to the many parents who also wrote letters of appreciation and thanks. We were delighted to read that the majority of parents - 98% - were happy with what the school provides. Fortunately we have a waiting list for all year groups.

The following issues have been raised in the questionnaires.

Play activities at lunchtime - A few parents said that these should be increased and we agree with this. Indeed we have recently been building up a resource of play equipment. Last month over £1,000 was spent on lunchtime play equipment which the children are now using. In addition to this, lunchtime supervisors and staff are encouraging the children to play games which are suitable and safe. Some lunchtime supervisors are being designated to act as play leaders for the children. We hope this will encourage all the children to be focused on safe and co-operative play.

Special assemblies -Two parents asked that we should give more notice about parents' special assemblies. We will now ensure that the dates of class assemblies are sent to parents on a termly basis. We are also updating our website to include these dates.

Learning to play a musical instrument - One parent asked for more variety in the choice of instruments to be learned. I would like to point out to parents that the children are selected by musical assessment and by their capacity to learn and to practice regularly. In nearly all schools in Birmingham, parents have to pay for the music lessons of the children selected. At St Mary's it has always been school policy to pay for music tuition and not ask for parents to contribute. The

following is a list of current instruments being taught in school: - Violin, Guitar, French Horn, Trumpet, Recorder and Asian Drumming. We will now be considering extending the repertoire of instruments that are being taught but parents will be asked to pay for this.

Parents who have commented on any other issues are being contacted to have further discussions with me so that we can all work together in partnership to make St Mary's C of E Primary School the very best that it can be.

A number of would like to know more about the Governors. The Governors have a display board in the entrance and can be contacted via the school. Governors are here to challenge and support the school on strategic issues and not those pertaining to individual children. Issues regarding individual children should be brought to the school's attention by following the procedures which states:

1. Talk to the class teacher first
2. Then the Head Teacher
3. If still not satisfied then refer to the Governing Body

Once again can I thank the many many supportive parents that we have at St Mary's who offer constructive views which we always try to act on. The following are examples of the school responding to parents views:- bike shed, increased homework, safety signs outside the school, increase of out of school clubs. In previous years there was a parent's comments box outside the school office. We will be resuming this system in September therefore any parents' views can be responded to on a regular basis. We do however insist that parents sign their names to any comments. We will then be able to respond appropriately.
